Facilitator fills this in and explains the activity before inviting consent.

We are testing whether the blank pack is understandable and usable. This is not treatment or a test of health outcomes. Start with a fictional example; using it at a routine visit is optional. You may use a supporter, skip questions or stop. Taking part or declining does not affect your care.

Keep every completed health sheet yourself. Do not share names, diagnoses, services, appointment dates or identifying stories in feedback. No health records, audio/video or names are requested. The facilitator records only a random code, consent date and design feedback, stored privately and locally. Free text can accidentally identify someone: keep comments about the design.

Choose a random code without initials or date of birth. There is no code-to-name list. Keep the code to request removal of your feedback until 14 days after your feedback session. After that, responses may be combined in an anonymous summary and cannot be individually removed. Individual responses are deleted within 30 days of that summary.

Possible burdens include time, writing effort or discomfort. You do not need to explain your health or complete every task. Ask the facilitator about the activity; ask your usual service about care. No benefit is guaranteed.
